LEAVE OF ABSENCE (LOA)

Students who wish to study for a semester or year at another U.S. college or university, where Wheaton does not have an exchange agreement, must apply for an approved **Leave of Absence (LOA)** from the **Committee on Admission and Academic Standing (CAAS)**. Students continue as Wheaton degree candidates, however, they establish a direct relationship with the institution where they will be enrolling in classes. No fees are paid to Wheaton College during the Leave of Absence. Leave of Absence Petition Forms are available in the Academic Advising Center.

- Merit scholarships are not available for LOA students.
- Need-based aid (Wheaton grants, federal and state funds and work-study) is not available for LOA study.
- The College cannot guarantee that credit will be awarded for courses completed while on Leave of Absence. Students are cautioned to discuss their plans with faculty and staff advisors before engaging in any academic programs. Wheaton faculty must review and approve credit for courses completed while away from the College. Regular transfer credit policies are in effect.
