INTRODUCTION

The purpose of this guide is to provide the student in **Religion 401** with a starting place for doing research. It gives the student a strategy for finding information on Religion using print, electronic and Internet resources. ELIZA, the Wallace Library's online catalog, available from the Library Home Page, is the "key" to finding information in the Wallace Library. Books, periodical titles, audiovisual material, special collection items, and interactive multimedia are all catalogued in **ELIZA**.

Keyword searching Issues:

1. Boolean Searching

- A. "doctrine ritual religion" as a Boolean "AND" search.
- B. Marking titles
- C. Saving marked records
- D. Extended display feature
- E. Exporting to **Endnote**

2. Truncation

- A. Enter "myth* ritual" as a Boolean, truncated search.
- B. How many hits do you get?
- C. Double click "Myth and ritual in the Plays of Samuel Beckett".
- D. Note subject headings for this entry.
- E. Double click "Myth in Literature". How many hits do you get?
- F. Mark any 2 titles.
- G. Save these marked records.
- H. Export your saved list.
- I. Export saved list to **Endnote**.

INDEXES/DATABASES

From OVID:

Wilson Humanities Index Indexes periodicals in all the humanities including religion and philosophy. 1984-.

1. At top of page, note types of searches possible.
2. Enter “social ritual” as keyword search phrase. How many hits?
3. Enter “ritual AND social” as a Boolean search. How many hits?
4. Display hits for set 2.
5. Follow “Library Catalog Holdings” link to see if Wheaton owns first 3 items.
6. Check the first 3 hits displayed.
7. Scroll down to Citation Manager. Note various “Actions” available in green on left.
8. Select “Complete Reference” to insure that you have complete bibliographic information.

9. "Display" "selected citations" to see if ISSN appears. (Before "Publication Year"). If not, ask Ref. Librarian to introduce you to "JAKE" to avoid delays in ILL and to insure that you have complete info for **Endnote** entries.

10. Select "Order" to request items from ILL.

11. Select "Direct Export" and "Save" to export citations into **Endnote**.

ATLA Database

ATLA: 1949 – present. ATLA is a scholarly, bibliographic database. It covers every aspect of religion and religion as it impacts on social issues. If Wheaton does not own the items indexed, they may be requested through ILL.

1. From the library home page select "**Electronic Resources**" and use the "**subject list**" to find **Religion** databases and then **ATLA**.
2. From the "**ATLA Database Menu**", select "**ATLA 1949-2002**", and then click on "**Start Searching**" top right.
3. Click on "**Change Display**" and under "**Fields to Display**" select "**Complete Record**". Hit "**OK**" top right.
4. Enter "**ritual and art**" and hit search. How many hits? _____
5. Follow "**Innovative Opac Weblink**" from several of your hits. Do you find an item owned by Wheaton?
6. Mark any 3 of your results by clicking the box to the left of the number.
7. Go to the 3 icons on the right and select "**Print**".
8. Check to see that you're printing only your "**marked records**" and "complete" versions of those records so that you'll have all the info you need.
9. Click the "**Preview**" button to see what you'll be printing and then **Print**. These printed lists will be useful in ordering items from ILL.
10. Go back to your list of results and e-mail your marked records to yourself.
11. Go to the Wallace Library home page. Click on "**Online Request Forms**". Bring up the ILL form for books or periodicals and check the info needed to order from ILL electronically.
