



After dropping its first three matches during the 2008–09 season, a young Wheaton team rebounded by falling only three times in its next 14 outings. Along the way, the Lyons placed third in the New England Women's and Men's Athletic Conference (NEWMAC) at 3–2 despite fielding a roster with only four upperclassmen. Wheaton made a tournament semifinal appearance for the seventh straight year before completing its season with an 11–7 mark. With only one regular starter lost to graduation, the Blue and White returns a veteran group for 2009–10.

Harry Altman '11 earned NEWMAC All-Conference honors for both singles (13–5) and doubles, as he and all-league partner Brian Krantz '11 produced a 10–3 mark as a tandem. Cullen Garrity '11 and Neall Oliver '12 also corralled conference singles accolades, as Garrity posted a 5–2 record in the sixth position and Oliver picked up 10 wins as the team's primary first-singles competitor. Nii Manfoi Davies '09 and Kyle Hudgins '10 went 9–6 as an all-league duo, as six different Lyons drew honors from the NEWMAC. Oliver and James Little '10 recorded 10 doubles triumphs, while Little and Krantz earned 11 and 10 singles victories, respectively.

Striving to teach student-athletes to cherish the value of competitive tennis in a context that encourages their growth as individuals and productive, responsible members of society, head coach Lynn Miller has been fulfilling that

commitment to excellence at Wheaton for 29 years.

Miller led the men's squad to an overall record of 11–7 during the 2008–09 fall and spring campaign, guiding the Lyons to a 3–2 NEWMAC mark and a spot in the league tournament semifinals despite fielding a roster with only four upperclassmen.

A three-time conference coach of the year and the 2004 United States Professional Tennis Association (USPTA) New England Coach of the Year, Miller has coached the men's program since its inception in 1990. She has posted an all-time record of 201–120

(.626) with 10-plus wins in 13 of 20 seasons while having individuals qualify for the NCAA Championship. She has also coached the highly successful women's program since the 1980–81 school year.

Under Miller's direction, Wheaton was honored in 2000 as Educational Association of the Year by the United States Tennis Association (USTA) of New England. Miller has played an important role in both teaching and coaching tennis. She is the director and head coach of the tennis camp at Wheaton, which is now in its 27th year. Miller also served as the head clinician

for Wheaton's annual high school tennis coaches' clinic. In 1996, she was the coach of the USTA New England Zonal Team in St. Louis.

Miller, who earned a bachelor's degree in physical education from Plymouth State University in 1974, was a two-time New England collegiate doubles champion. She was inducted into Plymouth State's Athletic Hall of Fame in 1989. Miller received a master's degree with a concentration in sports psychology from Pennsylvania State University in 1978.
