Is there a walk-in clinic nearby?

For walk-in care, Mansfield Health Center (508-339-4144) is located 10 minutes from campus. No appointment is necessary. Your health insurance will be billed for the visit, and you'll be responsible for your co-payment and deductible. If you belong to an HMO, you'll need a referral from your primary care physician. An ID and insurance card are absolutely required at the time of your visit.

Whom should I contact if I have questions regarding Norton Medical Center, health insurance, or health care options?

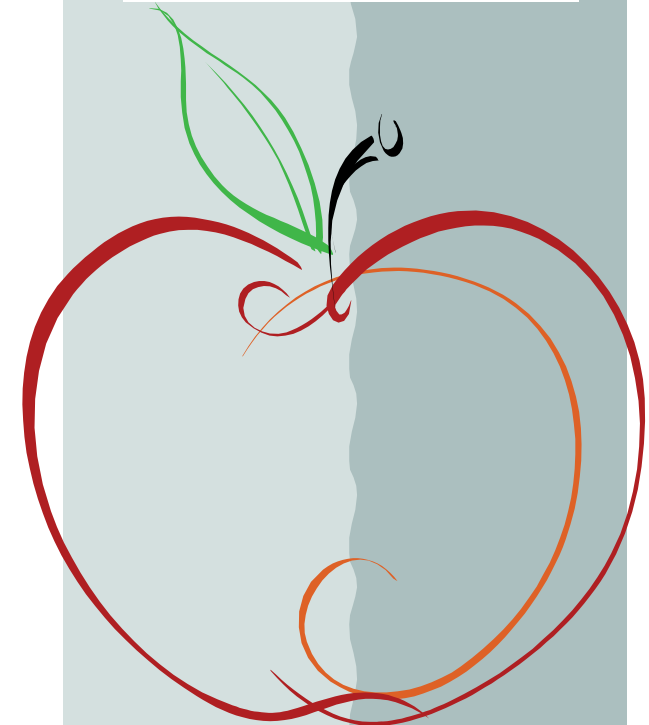

Where is Norton Medical Center located?

NMC is located on campus at 14 Taunton Avenue next to the Old Town Hall Bookstore.

How do I make an appointment?

Call 508-286-5400 to schedule an appointment. NMC provides same-day appointments only. Space is limited so it's important to call as soon as possible. You must have an appointment to be seen. There are no walk-in appointments available; ***NMC is not a walk-in clinic.***

Appointments are available Monday through Friday during "Wheaton Hours" — 3 hours set aside each day specifically for Wheaton student appointments.

All appointments scheduled during "Wheaton Hours" are **free** of charge regardless of insurance coverage. Charges incurred for phlebotomy, lab work and other tests and procedures, as well as prescriptions, are billed to your health insurance.

If you have questions about your symptoms or are unsure of the urgency of your illness, ask to speak with (or leave a message for) the ***triage nurse***. After speaking with you, she'll help determine the severity of your illness and schedule an appointment as needed.

If you become ill after NMC has closed for the day, call 508-286-5400 and leave a message with the answering service. The ***doctor-on-call*** will promptly return your call and address your concerns.

NMC is closed all major holidays including Columbus Day, Presidents Day, and Patriots Day.

Who are the health care providers at NMC and what services do they offer?

There are several physicians and nurse practitioners who are available to treat a variety of health problems. If your particular medical diagnosis calls for more specialized care, you'll be referred to a local specialist.

Commonly treated illnesses include colds, the flu, mono, strep throat, UTIs, gastrointestinal upsets, and other minor conditions. GYN exams, birth control, plan B, Gardasil, pregnancy testing, routine immunizations, confidential STD and HIV testing, and treatment for minor injuries are available as well.

Whom should I contact in an emergency?

Call Wheaton College Public Safety (508-286-8213 or x3333) for assistance with a medical or mental health related emergency. Several of the Public Safety Officers are EMTs and all are trained in basic first aid.

If indicated, Public Safety Officers will provide transportation to and from the Sturdy Memorial Hospital emergency room in Attleboro.

For Norton fire, police or rescue, call 911.
